LINC IT CANDIDATE PROCESS



FILL OUT THE LINC-IT INTEREST FORM

LINC-IT is a partnership between the Autism Society of NC (ASNC), the NC Division of Employment and Independence for People with Disabilities (EIPD), the NC Business Committee for Education (NCBCE), and UNC TEACCH[®].

AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER (ASD)

One must have an official ASD diagnosis to participate in LiNC-IT. In certain cases, Employment and Independence for People with Disabilities (EIPD) can fund a <u>psychological evaluation</u>.

START THE PROCESS OF OPENING AN EIPD CASE

After you fill out the LiNC-IT interest form, call your <u>local EIPD office</u>, and indicate your interest in employment through LiNC-IT. (EIPD was formerly known as Vocational Rehabilitation.)

CONTINUE EIPD PROCESS

Your EIPD counselor will meet with you a few times and determine your eligibility for services. If you are eligible, you and your

EIPD counselor will develop your Individualized Plan for Employment.



REFERRAL TO A JOB COACHING PROVIDER

Your Individualized Plan for Employment might include a include a referral to the ASNC, TEACCH®, or another job coaching provider. (One must have a job coach to be a LiNC-IT participant.)

JOB COACHING

Your job coach can help you with your resume, practice interviewing, and identifying potential jobs from employers who are not a part of LiNC-IT. They also provide support once you start employment.



LINC-IT PARTNERSHIP JOB OPPORTUNITIES

If an employer contacts LiNC-IT about a relevant employment or internship opportunity, with your permission your resume may be submitted. Upon review, you may be invited to interview for the position.
